Geoff is currently a private project-management consultant and professional problem-solver.

He was born in Glendive and raised in Bozeman. Geoff attended The University of Montana, where he received both his undergraduate (Political Science) and graduate degrees (Master of Public Administration with an emphasis on urban studies).

Geoff served as executive director of the Missoula Redevelopment from 1985 till 2004. In 1994, he was elected to the seven-member Local Government Study Commission where he helped author the City of Missoula Charter.

Geoff served for 10 years on the board of A Carousel for Missoula Foundation, and currently serves on the Community Youth

high school and college levels.

Born in Missoula, Bob was raised on a small grain and cattle ranch in the Flathead Valley, near Whitefish. He earned bachelor's degrees in History and Political Science from Montana State University, and his master's in Education from The University of Montana. He is a Navy veteran.

### Jim and Jeanne Clark

Jim and Jeanne Clark have been making music together for 46 years. They met at the University of Redlands Music School in California and were married in 1967. They have two sons and three grandchildren.

Jeanne holds a bachelor's degree in Music from the University of Redlands and a master's in Music from Northwestern, with majors in Pipe Organ and Church Music. She played music professionally and taught school (kindergarten through college) for many years. Jeanne has played with the symphony orchestras in Casper, WY, and Salt Lake City.

Jim retired in 2008 after six years of service as superintendent of Missoula County Public Schools. He formerly served as superintendent of the Torrington, WY, school system, and as teacher, assistant principal, principal and assistant superintendent in Casper, WY. He received his bachelor's degree in Music Education from the University of Southern Colorado, his master's in Music Education from the University of Utah, and his doctorate in Educational Leadership from the University of Wyoming.

### George Dennison

George Dennison became the 16th president of The University of Montana on 15 August 1990. Dennison came to Montana from Kalamazoo, Michigan, where he served as the Provost and Vice President for Academic Affairs of Western Michigan University (1987-90). In earlier years, he spent time at the Universities of Arkansas and Washington prior to 18 years at Colorado State University in Fort Collins. At Colorado State, he started as a history professor and then served in numerous other positions. He held simultaneously the positions as Associate Dean of the College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences and Associate Dean of the Graduate School for International Development Studies. He also served as Acting Academic Vice President, Associate Academic Vice President, and Director of Admissions and Records.

A historian by training, Dennison received his Bachelor's degree with highest honors in history from The University of Montana in 1962. He received his Master's degree from The University of Montana in 1963, then earned his Ph.D. in history from the Univer-

Foundation, and World Innovation Foundation.

George and his wife, Jane, have two children. Their son, Rick, played college football at Colorado State and then joined the Denver Broncos in 1982. He played linebacker for Denver for nine years and now serves as Offensive Coordinator for the Broncos. Their son, Robert, teaches mathematics and computer programming in Tecumseh, Kansas, just outside Topeka, and coaches football, wrestling, and track. The Dennisons have seven grandchildren.

### Adrienne Dussault

Born and raised in Missoula, Adrienne majored in voice/piano at The University of Montana. She continued her studies at the Music Academy of the West in Santa Barbara, sang with the San Francisco Opera's Merola Program, and was an apprentice with the Seattle Opera for four years.

Adrienne went on to enjoy a diverse musical career for many years, living in Seattle, New York City, Florida, and California, appearing in opera, musical theatre, and as a soloist with many symphonies. She has traveled extensively while performing her one-woman cabaret show in night clubs, for conventions, in the "Borscht Belt," and on many cruise ships.

Adrienne appeared most recently in "Jacques Brel" and "Mame" at MCT. One of her most rewarding roles has been as a volunteer for over 12 years with the Make-A-Wish Foundation.

### John Engen

John Engen became Missoula's 50th mayor on January 3, 2006. He had served a four-year term as a City Council member representing Ward 1 before winning the city-wide election for mayor in 2005.

Before entering public service, John worked for many years in the newspaper business in Missoula. An award-winning writer and editor, John's newspaper career began at 17 when he was invited to write a humor column for the Missoulian. He has managed a media division for a Montana retail chain and most recently operated his own advertising, public relations and publishing company, Engen Creative. In addition, he co-owns a travel agency with his wife, Tracy.

A Missoula native, John graduated from Hellgate High School and The University of Montana, where he earned a bachelor's degree in journalism.

John has served on a number of volunteer boards and volunteers for many organizations and causes. He is past president of the boards of directors of Missoula Downtown Association, Young Audiences of Western Montana and Missoula Food Bank.

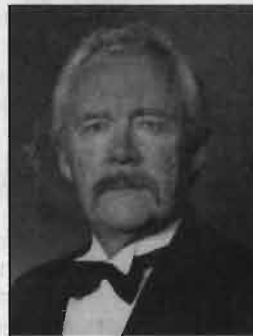
